Sit with the plant in front of you. Just for a moment.


Let your breath slow down. Let your attention settle.

This isn't just a story of a plant. It's your story, too — the story about something small inside you, full of quiet potential.




Look closely — at its roots, stem, leaves, flowers. Can you tell if it came from a seed?

ANATOMY OF A SEED:



THE WISDOM OF POTENTIAL

Deep beneath the surface, hidden from view and far from the noise of the world, lies a seed. Small, quiet, almost invisible — and yet, there's an entire universe that lives inside it.

Not just future leaves, not just a flower. It carries the codes of color, the blueprints of shape, and the whispers of time itself.





Every seed carries its own unique code, like a secret map pointing toward the possible. And no, not every seed sprouts – but each seed holds the full instructions for what it might become.

Some seeds can survive for thousands of years without sprouting. Thousands!

They hold life, patiently, while the world rushes by.

As if they're waiting for the right moment. As if they're listening. As if they believe.

We were seeds once, too.

In childhood — when we asked endless questions, talked to clouds, made friends with trees, and believed everything was possible — our inner code was the loudest. Not a code of behaviour, not of expectations, but of pure potential.



Everything we could become was already inside us. Not as a plan, but as a possibility.

	What did I know about myself as a child that I have forgotten now?	




Reflect on the following question.
